MANLEY 1924-1997**

■ Second son born to National Hero,

Norman Manley and his wife Edna, Michael Manley was born at Drumblair, St. Andrew on December 10, 1924.

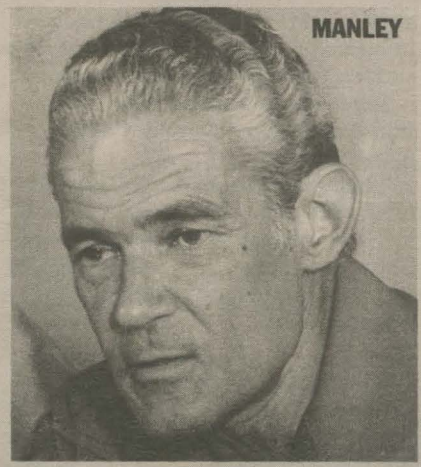
■ A past student of Jamaica College (JC), Mr. Manley volunteered for the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1943 at the age of 19.

■ After the war he gained a Bachelor degree from the London School of Economics.

■ Elected to the senate in 1962 and entered the house of representative in 1967 where he represented central Kingston.

■ In 1969 he became the second leader of the PNP.

■ Michael Manley became Jamaica's



fourth Prime Minister on February 28, 1972 making it the first time the party has held office since independence.

■ In 1992, due to illness, Mr. Manley resigned from public life. He was the first person to be elected to three terms in office.

■ Died on March 6, 1997. He was married five times and fathered two sons and three daughters. He also authored three books.
