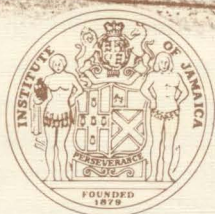

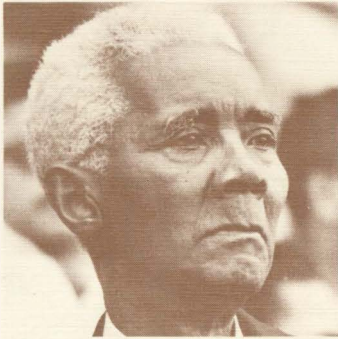

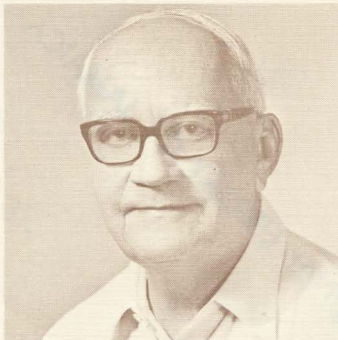

The Institute of Jamaica

THE Institute of Jamaica was established in 1879 by former Governor, Sir Anthony Musgrave, and over the years it has developed into being the most significant cultural, artistic and scientific organization in the country.

The Institute is administered by a Council comprising not less than 10 and no more than 25 persons appointed by the Minister of Culture, and includes in its membership no more than five Fellows, who are honorary members of the Council.
