PROFESSOR NETTLEFORD'S commitment to Caribbean regionalism and to institution-building has bestowed upon him an almost unprecedented level of respect, both nationally and internationally.

He is Co-Founder, Choreographer and Artistic Director of the National Dance Theatre Company of Jamaica which is recognized as one of the premier dance companies in the Western Hemisphere. Professor Nettleford has also represented Jamaica on International Boards such as Canada's IDRC, the OAS, ILO and UNESCO. In all of this, he has served the region with a high level of distinction. A political analyst, social and cultural historian, and authority on development and cultural dynamics, he has served as adviser to Caribbean Governments throughout the region and his influence has been enormous. At the local level, Professor Rex Nettleford is one of Jamaica's most distinguisher one, whose work has impacted on the life of many institution and people of the country. Formally, he is the embodiment of the possibilities and capacities of what can be achieved. A Pro Vice Chancellor who finds time for teaching, writing and advising, he lectures in Trade Unionism to both workers and management. His publications include Manley and the New Jamaica, Caribbean Cultural Identity, Inward Stretch, Outward Reach. For his outstanding National and International contributions, he has been awarded the Order of Merit by the Government of Jamaica. Other awards bestowed upon this eminent son of the Caribbean include the Gold Musgrave Medal and the Pelican Award from the Guild of Graduates of the University of the West Indies. Recognition from overseas include the Living Legend Award, a Doctor of Humanities Degree from the University of Hartford, Connecticut, the degree of Doctor of Letters from St. John's University, while Brooklyn College, City University of New York, awarded him the Presidential Medal.
