4.1 As the Head of the Department of Library Studies for most of the period since 1976 (the first West Indian to be appointed to the post), Professor Douglas has made an outstanding contribution to library education in Jamaica and the region.

In 1938 she was appointed Professor of Library Studies, a unique honour and distinction.

She has been an active member of the Jamaica Library Association, serving as President in 1976 and as a Vice Chairman of the National Council on Libraries, Archives and Documentation Services (NACOLADS) of which she has been a member since 1974.

The author of a number of articles and conference papers, Professor Douglas' influence has extended beyond the University as she has played a significant role in the development of the profession.
