Gains Master's degree in Library

Science

Miss Daphne Douglas, lecturer in the Department of Library Studies at the Mona Campus of the University of the West Indies, recently gained the Master of Library Science degree from the Graduate School of Library and Information Sciences of the University of Pittsburgh, U.S.A.

Miss Douglas, a Jamaican, was appointed a lecturer at the U.W.I. in 1971, having served for many years in the Jamaica Library Service. She was awarded an O.A.S. Fellowship in 1973 to read for the Master's degree in which she majored in Information Science, with emphasis on

Computer Studies.

Because of outstanding academic performance, she will be invited to become a member of Beta Phi Mu, the international scholastic honour society in Library Science, a U.W.I. news release said.

Miss Douglas received her secondary education at St. Hilda's Diocesan High School and studied Library Science at the Eastern Caribbean Regional Library School, Trinidad.

She later attended Leeds Library School, England, where she completed the final examination of the British Library Association and was elected to the Register of Fellows. In 1968, she took part in a special course at the Danish School of Librarian-
