Funds search launched

Governor General Florizel Glasspole has launched an appeal for funds for the Order of St. John Jamaica in a letter which is now on its way to 1,500 mail boxes in the island.

As president of the Council, the Governor General is concerned at the waning sources of funds available to the Order to maintain its several functions and services.

The Order has been established in Jamaica for over three quarters of a century and has rendered invaluable ambulance, First Aid and paramedical services during the many disasters which have afflicted the island in the period. On a continuous basis the Brigade and Association have trained many thousands of citizens in both the services and civilian life to be proficient in para medical skills.

Brigade members, in their familiar uniforms, are always standing by for emergencies at highly populated public occasions such as at motor racing meets, the race track, the National Stadium and so on.

The appeal for funds is being conducted mainly by mail and donations should be directed to the St. John Headquarters, Camp Road, Kingston during working hours.

The Governor General also recently appointed Knight of Grace of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem, Commander Rupert Henry Williams, as Chairman of the Council of the Order of St. John Jamaica.
