

Mrs. Glasspole left a name 'fragrant to remember'

The Rev. Caleb Cousins, Chairman of the Methodist District, who was delivering the remembrance speech, at the funeral service at the Coke Church on Thursday, said that he was very impressed with the manner she had brought up her children. Being a stimulating and joyful person, she also stood beside her husband, a Methodist minister, rendering valuable service.

During the main message by the Rev. C. L. Cadogan, President of the Methodist

Conference in the Americas and the West Indies, Mrs. Glasspole was described as one who played a very important part in the congregation over which her husband ministered.

Her activities during her husband's ministry was equal to that of an associate minister.

The Rev. Cadogan called on all sections of the community from Government down to the lowest level to help to uphold a life of quality, where it would be possible for people to be themselves and to accept and appreciate life as a God-given privilege.

Among those attending were Mr. David Coore, Minister of Finance, representing the Prime Minister; Mr. Dudley Thompson; Mr. Eli Matalon; Douglas Manley; Dr. Ken McNeill.

Representing the Opposition was Mr. Lynden Newland. Mr. Robert Lightbourne, of the U.P. was also there.

Other officials included Brigadier Rudolph Green; Mr. Leacroft Robinson, Attorney General; the Custos of St. Thomas, Mr. Isaac Matalon; Mr. O. Tomlinson, Custos of St. Ann; and the St. Andrew Custos, Mr. Henry Shaw, and his wife.

Attending too were the Nigerian High Commissioner and his wife, Mr. Andre Brink, Holland's Ambassador to Jamaica, was among other representatives of foreign

bodies and organizations.

Interment was at the Providence Methodist Church Cemetery.

The other two officiating Methodist ministers were the Rev. C. L. Beckford and the Rev. T. B. Rose.
