* GG honoured, raps bad behaviour

JAMAICA today is plagued by indiscipline in the form of bad drivers on the roads, "and the wicked attitude of many to others."

This was one of the points touched on by the Governor General of Jamaica, Sir Florizel Glasspole at a dinner reception put on in his honour by the Wolmers Old Boys Association, at the Jamaica Pegasus on Thursday night.

In a presentation which was for the most part spiced with hu-

mour, the Governor General cited examples from the newspapers, of cases where an individual was found using the road without the necessary papers or who had a defective vehicle.

He also made reference to the *Star* report of the man who threatened to turn over the bus if the passengers were not quiet, and in fact the bus was turned over.

The Governor General said that this kind of behaviour was unac-

ceptable.

Sir Florizel credited his good educational foundation, the discipline of his parents and his christian upbringing to his success in life.

He went on to say that his years at Wolmers were instrumental in instilling in him pride of self and discipline.

He said that the headmaster when he was going there, Mr. Reginald Murray was a great disciplinarian and that he had a

great impact on his life.

Sir Florizel was presented with a Maroon blazer and a scrapbook containing a selection of photographs and copies of newspaper clippings highlighting his achievements.

"This is your life", an affectionate memoir featuring highlights of the life and achievements of the Governor General was read by Mr. Robert McMillan, general manager of McMillan Advertising.
