

Plaque marks NW Manley's birthplace today

THE MEMORY of National Hero Norman Manley will be revived again today with the unveiling of a plaque in his honour at his birthplace in Roxborough, Manchester.

And tonight the seventh Norman Manley Award for Excellence will be made to an individual who has been excellent in the

communications field.

Born at Roxborough July 4, 1893, Norman Manley was an outstanding barrister, political freedom fighter and statesman.

Today's ceremony will celebrate his achievements, his excellence and integrity. His son Prime Minister Michael Manley and Governor General Florizel Glasspole will be present at the ceremony.

Norman Manley's memory is preserved in the Award named after him and to date those awards have gone to Dr. T. P. Lecky for his work in agriculture, Wesley Powell for his work in education, Louise Bennet for her work in the Arts, George Headley for his achievements in sports, Eddie Burke for his work in social services and Gertrude Swaby for her work in nursing.
