Ceremony for National hero

A COMMEMORATION CEREMONY in honour of National Hero, the late Norman Washington Manley, will take place on Sunday, July 4 at 10: a.m. at Roxborough in Manchester.

The occasion will centre around the unveiling of a plaque, that has been fixed near the spot where Mr. Manley's birthplace once stood. The house was recently destroyed by fire.

Norman Manley was born at Roxborough on July 4, 1893, where he lived

as a boy until the death of his father. After this, his mother moved with him to a property named Belmont in Guanaboa Vale, where her father Mr. Alexander Shearer, and herself operated a small farm.

The ceremony is being arranged by the Jamaica National Trust Commission and the Manchester Parish Council. Among those attending will be, the Governor General, Hon Florizel Glasspole, and the Prime Minister and Mrs. Michael Manley and the widow of the National Hero, Mrs. Edna Manley. **API**
