'Mostly Port Royal' opens at Morgan's Harbour

THE first in a series of happenings planned for Port Royal began yesterday with an exhibition of paintings by Albert Hule at Morgan's Harbour titled "Mostly Port Royal". As the name implies the works to be exhibited will comprise scenes done of the old city.

Hule, a noted name in Jamaican art circles, began his studies at the Ontario College of Art in Toronto and continued at Camberwell School of Art in London.

His career as an artist spans almost 50 years and he has been the recipient of outstanding awards from the Jamaican Government, including the O.D. in 1973. In addition his work has won him international acclaim, for instance in 1939 he received the award for the best exhibit at the New York World's Fair.

The exhibition which was declared opened by Miss Sonia Jones, Attorney-at-Law, also featured background music by Byard Lancaster. The regular Morgan's Harbour Buffet followed the exhibition.
