

## Artist of the year

Members of almost every artistic field in Jamaica attended on Monday night a party held at The Gallery, 17 Oxford Road to honour Jamaica's first Artist of the Year, Mr. Alvin Marriott.

The party which was very informal marked the climax of the Artist of the Year activities by the Contemporary Jamaican Artists Association. The selection was done some months ago at a meeting of the Association when Mr. Marriott was chosen by secret ballot.

Chairman of the function was Mr. A. D. Scott. Mr. Scott gave a brief outline of Mr. Marriott's career and congratulated him on having achieved such suc-

In a letter from Mr. Rex Nettleford, read by Mr. Scott, Mr. Nettleford on behalf of the Na-tional Dance Theatre stated the function to honour Jamaica's first "Artist of The Year" was one of the most important occasions in the cultural and artistic life of the country.
