He was also the first editor of the Pioneer Press of The Gleaner Company which brought to the notice of many Jamaicans the writings of many native sons and daughters and helped to instil into readers an appreciation of our literary achievements.

An urbane, well-read and civilised character in the true sense of that appellation he still had much to give to Jamaica when he was suddenly taken from our midst. It is good to remember him.
