be reducing the whole thing to a farce.

Surely those who drafted the Constitution never contemplated such a thing. It is of all bedies unqualified to adjudicate on a matter of that kind and the Vovernor should have asked for advice not from the Executive Council but from the Privy Vouncil as set out in the quotation I have read. That is the only point I wish to make Sir, and I want it to be considered by the Party in power - by the Majority Party, when matters are brought before them in future, because I feel it has everything to do with good Vovernment and it is no use coming here and talking about this being propaganda. That is no answer to an important public question and if persisted in will be reducing public matters to a farce if members instead of replying to points raised just throw up their hands and say it is propaganda.
