"No matter our political differences, we have been able to create an environment where despite rivalry and differences we are an embodiment of persons and out of many we remain one people," said the prime minister.


Patterson was speaking at a dinner hosted at Vale Royal, his private residence, on Wednesday in recognition of Seaga's retirement from the legislature.
