POPE AND P.M.: Pope John Paul II (left) chats with Jamaican Prime Minister Edward Seaga during a private audience Friday morning at Castel Gandolfo, the summer palace of the Vatican. Mr. Seaga was the first Jamaican Prime Minister to be received by a Pope since Jamaica established relations with the Holy See. A J.I.S. release said the audience lasted 20 minutes during which Pope John Paul enquired extensively of developments in Jamaica and the Caribbean. Prime Minister Seaga extended the good wishes of the Government and people of Jamaica to His Holiness and expressed appreciation for the initiatives taken by Pope John Paul to bring peace to troubled areas of the world.
