King of bowlers

OURTNEY Walsh is the king of bowlers. On Monday the Jamaica and West Indies fast bowler became the new world record holder of the most wickets in Test cricket with 435 when, in his 114th Test match, in the second innings of the second Test against Zimbabwe at Sabina Park, he removed Henry Olonga to surpass Kapil Dev's 434.


In stepping onto the throne and following the footsteps of off-spinner Lance Gibbs who bettered Fred Trueman's 307 in 1976, Walsh is the second West Indian to hold the record, and based on the sentiments expressed by fans around the region as he closed in on it, it could not have happened to a nicer guy.

In his 16 years at the highest level of the game, Walsh has been the ideal cricketer - a player blessed with a special talent who dedicated himself to the game, committed himself to the game, and whether playing for Excelsior, Melbourne, Jamaica, Gloucestershire or the West Indies, always gave it his best shot.

Walsh is more than a great cricketer, however. He is also a gentleman.

Numbered among the greatest fast bowlers of all time and now the champion of them all, Walsh is humility personified. The 37-year-old fast bowler is someone who has achieved greatness, but who, in spite of all the accolades which have come his way, the honours which have been bestowed on him, remains untouched by greatness. 

O COURTNEY Walsh, the most satisfying thing about breaking Kapil Dev's record was the fact that it happened at home.

"It was very satisfying that at the end of the day it happened in Jamaica," he said on Monday after surpassing Kapil Dev's 434 wick-

Walsh, said he had a gut feeling he would have broken the record on Monday.

"I felt today (Monday) was the day. I felt very confident from last

night. When I got the first wicket I knew it was coming," said Walsh.
"When I got the second I felt it was only a matter of time but when Zimbabwe started to lose a lot of wickets it crossed my mind that I might not reach the record.

I told the skipper that although the record is approaching, the Test match was more important but I was very happy when he came back

to me and asked me how I felt. I told him I was ready and he gave me the ball. He showed the confidence in me to give me the ball...it was just a great team effort."

Walsh said the record had affected his concentration while on tour

of New Zealand and was relieved to have it out of the way.

"Finally, it is over," said Walsh. "I went to New Zealand and tried to get it out of the way. I think I pressured myself down there...tried a bit too much and too hard. I was using up a lot of energy. A lot more than normal. It was a bit sapping. Now that I have gotten it out of the way I can relax and enjoy my cricket again."

walked with kings, he is a king, and he has not lost the common touch.

Born on the other side of the southern wall at Melbourne, Courtney grew up on cricket: he grew up hearing the sound of bat hitting ball, evening after evening, Saturday and Sunday after Saturday and Sunday, his idols at Melbourne included another great fast bowler, Michael Holding, and when he first played for the Melbourne Youth Club, he probably had visions of following in Holding's footsteps. And he

Like Holding, he not only represented Melbourne, but also the Jamaica Youth team, Jamaica, and finally, in 1984 in Australia, the West Indies.

Today, this cricketer who is one of only three bowlers in the history of the game to take 400 and more wickets in Test cricket, and who has taken more wickets than any, is the toast of XLCR, Melbourne, Jamaica, and the West Indies.

In celebrating the greatest achievement of a great crick-

eter, the people should remember not only his skill with the ball, but also the dedication and commitment, the hard work and the determination which, rolled into one, has been an example to a generation of Jamaicans and West Indians over the years.

The people, especially the young people, should remember how he dealt with adversity - how he bounced back each time following his omission from the West Indies team.

They should also remember not only that he captained the West Indies, but also the way he led the team and the way he stepped aside.

He led the West Indies with dignity, and when he stepped aside, he did so with dignity.

In stepping aside amidst all the controversy, Courtney Walsh said he loved the game, he loved West Indies cricket, and that once he could still contribute he was prepared to give everything for the glory of West Indies cricket. He has done just that, and for that, the king of bowlers, the world record holder, deserves an extra special round of applause.


"In the early years, Courtney was pretty much the same as he has always been - a humble person with manners and respect for everybody. We got along very well," he continued.


"Monica and myself have always been there for him. So, we are still together after all this time."

Note: This article was first published in the Barbados Nation on March 14 last year to mark Courtney Walsh's 400th wicket in Test cricket.

N April 13, this year in Grenada, the Vice Chancellor of the UWI, in the annual match organised under his auspices, will honour the four great retired fast bowlers of the Lloyd-Richards regime - an era with no parallel in the Test history of the game.

In this pantheon of heroes are to be found the living spirits of Andy Roberts, Michael Holding, Malcolm Marshall, and Joel Garner. Between them they are responsible for the lawful appropriation of 1086 Test wickets.

But as we speak, Courtney Walsh, first in line for entry into this Valley of Kings, has as carry-on luggage some 400 bags, with prospects of another 50 in future journeys, making him the most overweight traveller in the history of the game.

We, the public, however, stand as sentinels guarding entry to the claim to greatness. Fully conscious of the responsibility, and mindful of the prevalence of false prophets and possible imposters, our judgement are comparable only to that of St. John of scriptural Revelations.

We have placed Mr. Walsh within the scales, and we are satisfied that his rights of passage are incontrovertible.

And so, we open the doors to enable the facts to speak and to settle the matter. But Mr. Walsh's claim to greatness has its own special features that must not go without explicit articulation. He stands before us today as a colossus, the last standing hero of a once invincible empire, reminding us of a glorious past yet leading and urging us on, at a time of decline and despair, to take up the challenge of reconstruction and revitalisation.

In this regard Walsh has taken up a double responsibility which sets him apart. While all around him seems to be crashing into ruin, the messages emanating from his mind remain as

focused as any missile can ever be, and knowing this we feel comforted that out pride - if nothing else - is being sustained. The journey to achievement and excellence, he seems to be telling us, and the world, is not for the sprinter but the long distance

The test is in the time, not just the timing of achievement since visions by necessity, must be situated beyond the horizon within the imaginations. Greatness in the Caribbean, furthermore, must not only be respected; it must be celebrated because it is the fine fruit of a turbulent civilisation whose history, we are told, speaks more to destruction than creativity.

This is why, as a Caribbean

response the indispensable importance of style and grace. Here, Mr. Walsh has shown that the statistics alone are never sufficient, for they cannot be used in the judgement of a cricketer's humanity and inherent character.

In his public profile, (the private soul belongs to a greater judge) he has demonstrated a disarming dignity, a sense of caring, and a calmness, the test of which is that many a Caribbean mother wishes instinctively to invite him to rest his tortured head upon their breast. And so it should be.

Such an embrace tells us as much about Courtney's moments as Caribbean mothering. His journey to the 400 mark has been a turbulent and tortured one. Like many other ardent followers

his early temporary abandonments from the Test side, his resurrections, and triumphs.

I celebrated as he was elevated to the captaincy and shed tears

when it was taken away. Now, again, I celebrate his ascendancy to something equally precious recognition of another kind of leadership of West Indies cricket and his unswerving commitment, dedication and durability.

Therein, we have found a way to honour a great mind, and in so doing bring dignity to our own dealings. Once again, cricket

emerges the champion, for to watch Walsh is to gaze upon the goodness that is the guardian of this great game.

RISING deejay Zumjay's tribute to cricketer Courtney Walsh received good airplay in the run-up to the fast bowler becoming the most prolific wicket-taker ever in the sport. He broke the record held by India's Kapil Dev.

Now that Walsh has attained the magic number of 435, in front of an 11,000-strong home crowd at Sabina Park, the song, dubbed 'Courtney', will be officially released by Penthouse Records tomorrow as 'Courtney fever' sweeps Jamaica and the rest of the Caribbean.

The song was laid on a track conceptualised by Stephen 'Lenky' Marsden in January of this year.

'The rhythm which is called 'Angel' took about four hours to make. It has a reggae dancehall feel and is futuristic sounding. I got the idea for the rhythm while I was on tour, so it wasn't hard to come in-studio and just lay it down," Marsden told The Gleaner.

'The first time I heard Zumjay do 'Courtney' on the rhythm, I knew it was a boom song. It will be released by producer Donovan Germaine tomorrow," Marsden said.

"I went home one day, and my mother told me that Richie B was saying that someone ought to write a song about Courtney Walsh's achievements and I just got the inspiration to do it. I approached Donovan Germaine and he liked it. He said it was well put together, so I recorded it. I never knew that people would like it so much," said DJ Zumjay.


