Huge crowd sees grand ceremony at King's House

..With a ceremony befitting the occasion, His Excellency the Most Honourable Florizel Glasspole was sworn in as Jamaica's third Governor-General at King's House yesterday.

People from all walks and stations in life attended the inauguration and the large crowd seated on the lawns of King's House made a colourful picture

There was an atmosphere of anticipation as the crowd waited for the ceremony to begin. A combined band comprised of the Jamaica Military Band, the Band of the First Jamaica Regiment and the Jamaica Constabulary Band conducted by Ted Waite, played to the waiting audience.

Promptly at 6:00 p.m. a fanfare of trumpets sounded

and dignitaries headed by the Prime Minister and Mrs. Manley descended the stairs to their seats.

Acting Governor-General Herbert Duffus welcomed the gathering and explained the procedure of the programme.

Prayers were said by Anglican Bishop Cyril Swaby and Roman Catholic Archbishop Samuel Carter.

The Commission appointing Mr. Glasspole as Governor-General was then read by the Governor General's secretary, Neville Smith.

Mr. Glasspole took the Oath of Allegiance and the Oath of Office, and the personal standard of the Governor General was hoisted.

Present at the inauguration ceremony were Sir Clifford and Lady Campbell, government ministers and their wives, Government MP's and their wives and members of the diplomatic corps and of the clergy. Four Opposition MP's were present: Lynden Newland, Edwin Allen, Leopold Lynch and Adrian Bonner.
