

# Albert Huie's art in Texas

Air Jamaica will be sponsoring an exhibition of works by distinguished Jamaican artist Albert Huie in Houston, Texas, between October 30 to November 12. The airline's participation forms part of its efforts to introduce an aspect of Jamaican culture to its most recently acquired route, during Houston's salute of the Art's Month.

The exhibition will be held at the Dubose Gallery and some thirty pieces of work by the artist will be on show.

This is the first time that a Jamaican artist will be exhibiting his works in the popular Dubose Gallery in Houston. These pieces will be mostly scenery and portrait paintings.

Albert Huie's works of art

have won him several awards both in Jamaica and abroad. In 1939 his paintings were selected by the International Business Machine Corporation for entry into the World Art Fair in New York and Chicago. One of his paintings "The Counting Lesson", was featured in the New York Times.

His works have also been selected for presentation to Princess Margaret and in 1961 he won the National Prize for his paintings of "Thursday Night," which has since been reproduced in Canada.

Huie's latest award is the 1980 Institute of Jamaica Centenary medal for his outstanding work in the development of Jamaican art.
