THE DISASTER RISK MANAGEMENT ACT

THE DISASTER RISK MANAGEMENT (ENFORCEMENT MEASURES)
(NO. 2) (AMENDMENT) (NO. 3) ORDER, 2020

WHEREAS the Minister responsible for disaster preparedness and emergency management has given written notice to the Prime Minister that Jamaica appears to be threatened with or affected by the SARS - CoV-2 (Coronavirus COVID-19), and that measures apart from or in addition to those specifically provided for in the Disaster Risk Management Act should be taken promptly:

AND WHEREAS on the 13th day of March, 2020, the Prime Minister by Order declared the whole of Jamaica to be a disaster area:

NOW THEREFORE:

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Prime Minister by section 26(2) of the Disaster Risk Management Act, and every other power hereunto enabling, the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Disaster Risk Management (Enforcement Measures) (No. 2) (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 2020, and shall be read and construed as one with the

Disaster Risk Management (Enforcement Measures) (No. 2) Order, 2020, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order, and all amendments thereto.

2. Paragraph 3A of the principal Order is amended by deleting the words “Each person who entered Jamaica after March 18, 2020, shall forthwith contact the Ministry responsible for health and wellness” and substituting therefor the words “Each person who entered Jamaica on or after March 18, 2020, shall forthwith contact the Ministry responsible for health and wellness”.

3. Paragraph 9A(2) of the principal Order is amended by renumbering sub-paragraphs (v) and (w) as sub-paragraphs (y) and (z) and inserting next after sub-paragraph (u) the following sub-paragraphs—

- “ (v) persons engaged in the transportation of manufactured products;
- (w) persons employed to Factories as defined in the Factories Act;
- (x) Mayors and Councillors of Municipal Corporations;”.
