Dr. Hazel Eloise Bennett is considered one of Jamaica's most distinguished librarians. As the Deputy Director of the fledgling Jamaica Library Service during the period 1957 - 67, she was actively involved in the planning and administration of the rapidly expanding island-wide public library service and schools library service. She also had a lasting influence on countless numbers of young librarians in Jamaica and the rest of the Caribbean during the period 1971 - 88 when she served as a Lecturer and then Senior Lecturer at the Department of Library Studies at the University of the West Indies..

However Hazel Bennett is more than a librarian, as she is also a scholar and author. She has written numerous professional articles and papers and her doctoral dissertation on the history of libraries in Jamaica is a seminal work in its field. She has been involved in audio-visual productions and along with Sir Philip Sherlock, co-authored the highly acclaimed **Story of the Jamaican People** published in Jamaica earlier this

year. This work tells the story of our history from our point of view and places a new perspective on the struggles and achievements of the Jamaican people since the start of our recorded history: a landmark in historical scholarship in Jamaica.
